4. ACTIVITIES

The Icelandic Geopark Committee held two formal meetings in 2020, one in February and the other (digital) in November. At the November meeting Sigurður Sigursveinsson replaced Lovísa Ásbjörnsdóttir as Chair of the Icelandic Geopark Committee.

The main achievement of the Committee in 2020 was the development of a website for the committee. It was supported by a grant from the Ministry of Education and Culture and was opened in November 2020 (www.geopark.is). The two Icelandic geoparks plus Lovísa Ásbjörnsdóttir from the Icelandic Institute of Natural History developed the content of the website and met ten times during the year for this purpose, mostly via online meetings.

Also, considerable effort were made regarding a bid to hold the 10th International Conference on UNESCO Global Geparks. As it turned out the bid was not handed in despite the full support of the Icelandic UNESCO Commission, as we were not able to guarantee the considerable financial resources necessary for such a meeting.
