

Sustainable tourism (Geotourism)

1) **GUNUNG RAYA GRANITE**

Since 2019, Langkawi UNESCO Global Geopark has been working on a new conservation area at Gunung Raya. The Langkawi igneous bodies are also known as Gunung Raya Granite. The age of Langkawi granite is dated to be around the late Triassic geological era; hence, the emplacement of Langkawi granite should have taken place almost concurrently with the region's major tin-bearing granites. Gunung Raya's lush rainforest houses the *roti canai* gecko (*Cnemaspis roticanai*) endemic to Langkawi UGGp and humorously named after the beloved national breakfast.

2) TUBA ISLAND

To date, Langkawi UGGp also designed a new geotrail product at Pulau Tuba as an innovative tourism product. Tuba Island, the 3rd largest island with seven fisherman villages, has a potential area that has yet to attract the attention of

policymakers, entrepreneurs, and tourists alike. The island's geologically unique folded granite sill which is one of **the only specimens found in Malaysia**; a horizontal sheet intrusion between older layers of sedimentary rock that was intruded by limestones.

New education programs on conservation, sustainable development, and disaster risk reduction

1. Bio-remediation Program

1. The Bio-Waste Processing Project Using Black Soldier Fly (BSF) Larvae has been selected as a pilot project for the implementation of the Malaysian Family Bio-remediation Program targeting the community on Langkawi UNESCO Global Geopark area. This project aims to empower the BSF farming community, the hospitality industry, local community development agencies, and other parties involved in overcoming the issue of excess organic waste from the hospitality, agriculture, food, and domestic waste industries on Langkawi Island. Through this BSF project, it has the potential to produce an alternative source of food for poultry.







2. Langkawi ISWA BEACON Conference 2022

The shift from a linear to a circular economy is a major challenge that requires a strong commitment to sustainable management of waste and resources. Therefore, to achieve a sustainable solid waste management through this, we need to reduce the waste to minimum by reusing, repairing, refurbishing and recycling existing materials and products. Hence, less waste are generated through the development of sustainable products with greater recycling capacities indirectly will reducing landfilling to a minimum. The event brought together leaders, policymakers, experts and enthusiasts around the world to share their experiences and knowledge focusing on circular economy from the waste management aspect.









3. New Inisitive: idamanXchange project



idamanXchange is a recycling programme that gives rewards through the use. The programme is also in line with our objective of enhancing public practice in recycling activities as well as to support the Government in the Separation at Source initiatives.

1. MoU between Langkawi UGGp, Malaysia and Mudeungsan UGGp, Korea



In 2022, Langkawi UGGp and Mudeungsan UNESCO Global Geopark, Korea agreed to build a closer working relationship endorsed through a virtual signing ceremony of the Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on cooperation in the field of geopark management. This MoU marks a sign of cooperation between both parties in fulfilling their respective duties and functions through information exchange and sharing of mutually beneficial geopark initiatives.

With the signing of this MoU, both parties have therefore expressed their interest in engaging in collaborative activities about the sustainable development of the two geoparks involved. These include activities in areas such as tourism promotion, education, research, and community development in the respective geopark territories.
