- organization of 3 conferences presenting the link between geology, paleontology and climate to raise public awareness of climate change and the need to adapt our behavior accordingly

- Training days for guides and partners of the territory on several topics (general geology, landscapes reading, links with soils or flora, built heritage, etc.) 55 people trained
- The 2023 program for school interventions integrates now activities around natural risks and their consequences
