2025 GGN Film Festival: Call for Entries!

The 2025 GGN Film Festival will mark its third edition during the 11th International GGN Conference in Kutralkura UNESCO Global Geopark, Chile, in September. This unique festival offers an exceptional opportunity to bring together Geopark directors and documentary filmmakers to collaborate in creating new documentary and promotional videos about Geoparks.

Festival Objectives

The festival aims to foster the creation of high-quality videos within UNESCO Global Geoparks, showcasing their stunning landscapes, rich heritage, and ongoing sustainable development efforts.

How to Participate?

Filmmakers interested in entering must first establish contact with a UNESCO Global Geopark or official Aspiring UNESCO Global Geopark and define their project. Direct submissions from filmmakers will not be accepted.

Each video must be officially submitted through a UNESCO Global Geopark or official Aspiring UNESCO Global Geopark.

Video Requirements

To be eligible, candidate videos must meet the following specifications:

Duration: Between 2 and 6 minutes Resolution: UHD or 4K quality

Geopark Logos: Include the UNESCO Global Geopark logo at both the beginning and end of the video, with a small flag of the concerned country.

Subtitles: One version with English subtitles and one without subtitles.

Copyright: All images must have the proper copyright ownership by the producer.

Video Themes

The videos should showcase the UNESCO Global Geopark or Aspiring UNESCO Global Geopark in one of the following ways:

- -General Overview: Present the UNESCO Global Geopark or Aspiring UNESCO Global Geopark, highlighting its geological, natural, cultural, and intangible heritage, sustainable development efforts, and more.
- -Thematic Focus:

Videos may focus on specific actions or activities in any of the following areas:

- Heritage Conservation: Efforts to conserve geological, natural, cultural, or intangible heritage.
- Education: Educational initiatives at all levels within the Geopark.
- Research & Innovation: Contributions to scientific research and innovation.
- Poverty Reduction: Initiatives aimed at reducing poverty in the region.
- Sustainable Development: Activities related to local products, geotourism, stakeholder involvement and more
- Local Population Involvement: The active participation of local communities in the Geopark's activities.
- Gender Equality: Projects promoting gender equality, such as women's cooperatives.
- Water Resources: Conservation and management of water resources.
- Marine Environments: Initiatives focused on marine conservation.
- Good Health: Sport events and health initiatives in the Geopark.
- Networking: National or international networking activities.
- Natural Hazards Mitigation: Actions to reduce the risks from natural hazards.
- Climate Change Adaptation: Efforts to adapt to and mitigate climate change impacts.

Special Focus for 2025

This year, particular emphasis will be placed on gender equality in Geoparks, community empowerment, and the relationships/actions between Geoparks and indigenous communities.
